# Mid-States Corridor will have Regional Impact


- Mid-States Corridor will provide an expressway linking Indianapolis, IN (and points north) to Nashville, TN (and points south).
- Only requires approximately 50 miles of new construction to complete (depending on future route selection).
- Mid-States Corridor will also provide a necessary I-65 alternative.
- Comparison of routes:

Route	Distance	Time	
I-65	301 miles	4:40	
Mid-States Corridor	306 miles	4:45	
I-24 to I-69	330 miles	5:10	




# Regional Cargo and Distribution Hubs

- Mid-States Corridor would be an important link between largest cargo airports in the United States.
- Mid-States Corridor would be an essential traffic route for regional freight distribution.
- Mid-States Corridor would provide economic benefit both regionally and to the entire state of Indiana.
- Congestion and unpredictable traffic flow currently negatively impact freight operations, forcing large companies to consider relocation out of Indiana or to not move to Indiana.



### Highway US 231 -Current Average Daily Traffic Counts

- There are currently substantial daily traffic counts on Highway US 231, confirming its congested status.
- These traffic counts raise concerns regarding safety, efficiency, and connectivity.
- INDOT has identified that Highway US 231 will become a Category F rated roadway by 2030.
- Significant truck traffic is avoiding Highway US 231 and using I-64, I-69, and I-65 to travel north.



## Mid-States Corridor -Projected Average Daily Traffic Counts

- Mid-States Corridor will provide safe, efficient travel for vehicle and truck traffic originating in south-west Indiana.
- Total traffic is expected to increase by 37%, and truck traffic by more than 100%.
- Mid-States Corridor traffic counts projected to be higher than I-69 traffic counts.



#### Summary of Economic Impact

- Dubois and Spencer Counties have a combined GDP of \$4 billion annually.
- Mid-States Corridor is estimated to generate:
  - \$1 billion per year in new spending for Dubois and Spencer Counties.
  - \$32.5 billion over 30-year projection.
  - \$4.3 million per year in local taxes.
  - \$1 million per week in savings on vehicle maintenance and gas for Dubois and Spencer Counties
  - 50% reduction in accidents in Dubois County, leading to \$9.3 million in annual savings.
- Mid-States Corridor will provide access to larger markets for talent, goods, services, and tourism.
- 7,000 additional jobs supported by the Mid-States Corridor.



#### Holiday World –Visitation Patterns

- Holiday World attracts millions of visitors to Indiana.
- Holiday World's visitation is impacted by its accessibility to population centers.
- The population centers with sufficient access have greater rates of visitation.



- Visitation rates from northern population centers are lesser due to lower accessibility.
- Generally expect visitation to be greater, not lesser, within the same state.



### Regional Commerce Footprint

- Walmart's commerce footprint demonstrates the importance of Dubois County as a regional retail hub.
- The area contained within the red outline shows the regional retail influence, bordered generally by I-69 to the west, I-64 to the south, and State Road 37 to the east.
- Jasper's importance as a regional commerce hub is reinforced by the extension of its footprint into other commerce areas.



#### Population Projection

- A primary concern of rural counties is declining population.
- Dubois and Spencer
   Counties currently have nominal projected population increases.
- Mid-States Corridor is projected to double the population growth of Dubois and Spencer Counties.
- A ripple effect is expected on population growth in other counties within the Mid-States Corridor study area.
